## **What is Refacing?**

Your old cabinet doors and drawer fronts are removed and discarded. With Kitchen Magic Refacers, Inc., the exterior of your cabinet boxes are covered or “refaced” with genuine all birch, cherry or oak in designer finishes to match the all new solid wood doors and drawer fronts.

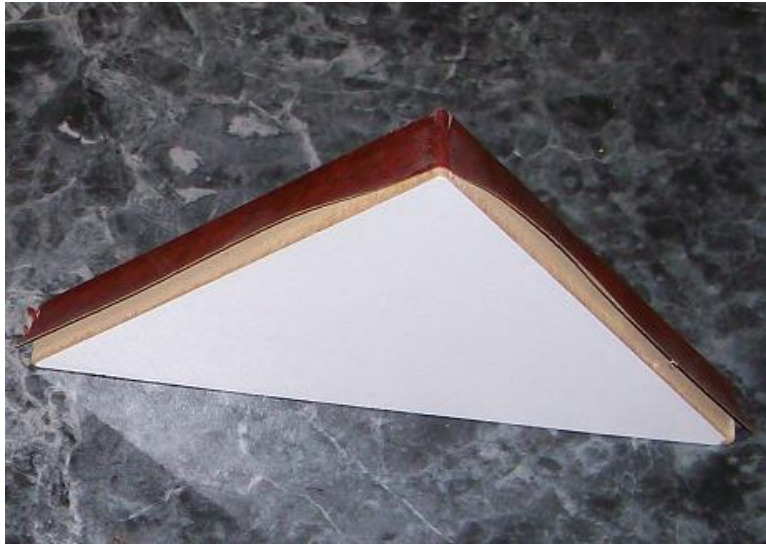


In addition, new hinges and handles are installed. Our experts will install your choice of Granite, Silestone®, or Corian® countertop and sink and will handle any plumbing, electrical and appliance work. We can add roll-out shelves, add islands, modify cabinets to accommodate microwave ovens and range hoods, install glass doors, and more. Modern refacing provides a “makeover” to create your dream kitchen at a surprisingly low cost.

**The size and complexity of your kitchen determines the number of days to get the kitchen of your dreams. In most cases it takes 4 days or less.**

# 1. Quality and Type of Materials: What materials are used for doors, drawer fronts, and cabinet coverings?

More than 93% of kitchen refacing contractors use Medium Density Fiberboard (MDF) doors and drawer fronts wrapped in Rigid Thermal Foil (RTF). The remaining 7% use all solid wood materials. MDF, also known as wood core, furniture core, sawdust and glue, industrial grade wood, or particleboard, is essentially wood dust held together with formaldehyde resins. MDF materials are not only *hazardous to your health*, but they are covered with inferior Rigid Thermal Foil (RTF) materials.



RTF is a type of laminate that is applied with glue and heat. Ovens, dishwashers, and coffeemakers create heat in the surrounding areas and attack the glue on these materials, causing them to peel, curl, turn yellow or chip. In addition, many contractors coat the cabinet exteriors with  $\frac{1}{8}$  inch or thinner laminate veneer that is simply glued onto the old cabinets.

***Kitchen Magic Refacers, Inc. uses only SOLID HARDWOOD doors and drawer fronts, and covers your cabinet exteriors with GENUINE HARDWOOD veneer up to  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch thick. The wood veneer is secured by carpenter brads and panel adhesive. Kitchen Magic Refacers, Inc. does not use plastics or inferior composite materials. This means you have no peeling, curling, yellowing, chipping and, most importantly, no health hazards!***



## 2. Design and Installation Workmanship: What are the qualifications of the designers and installers?



A 2004 industry study showed that 88% of kitchen refacing contractors use salespeople with less than one year of design experience. When it comes to installers, over 90% of them are subcontractors who do not specialize in kitchens, have little or no cabinetmaking experience and limited capabilities. This is a decision you will live with every day, so make absolutely certain that you are getting “the kitchen of your dreams” from skilled and qualified designers and craftsmen.

## 3. How long should the materials and workmanship last and is it guaranteed?

The biggest fear homeowners have of kitchen refacing is that the final product will not last, due to inferior materials and workmanship. Over 85% of the contractors offer guarantees that are “prorated” on materials or only cover labor from 90 days up to one year. Some may even offer a “10 year warranty on hardware” – but most homeowners are not aware that “hardware” only means the knobs and hinges. Read the warranty. The salesperson is required by law to have it available for you to read.

## 4. Scheduling and Installation Accuracy and Punctuality: How can I be sure the job will start and end on time?

In 2003, there were over 1,600 complaints filed against home improvement contractors in Maryland alone. The biggest complaints relate to the many and continuous delays on promised start and end dates of a project and that the salespeople arrive late or *do not show up at all*. Most kitchen refacing contractors pack in as many appointments and installation jobs into as little time as possible. This leads to showing up late or being a no-show for appointments and to delaying or pushing back installation start and finish dates. While your cabinet refacing is in progress, you will not have the use of your kitchen, so it is important to make sure the job starts and ends as promised.

They are also unable or unwilling to deal with different types of countertops or work with electrical, plumbing and appliances.
